Minutes of the August meeting had been distributed; motion to approve was made by Pam and seconded by Felicia, minutes were approved. Treasurer's report for August was presented by Tricia, motion to accept by Felicia, seconded by Nance, report was accepted. The current balance is \$9,730.20 between the various accounts, including bank, Venmo, and Paypal.

Membership: Pam reported 118 members with paid renewed membership thus far for 2023.

Events: The Harvesting Fall Festival is scheduled for 28 October.

BHEV: Bob, the liaison, reported that his contact at BHEV, Vern, would like to use the PBCA community sign to advertise the CMSAF Binnicker Memorial Run to be held on 07 October.

Poquito Boat Ramp Park: Dave reported no new issues.

Street & Traffic Safety: Bob is still waiting for the traffic report on vehicle numbers and speed.

Street Directors: A mailer (card) is being printed and will be mailed to the entire neighborhood.

Old Business: The Abandoned Homes committee has met since the last board meeting, but Nance discussed Life Estate transfers. Jane reported that all but three of the plaques for the Veteran's Memorial are complete. The cost will be \$1445.06. They will be affixed to the posts and new flowers will be planted; Felicia reported that the irrigation system is working now, with well pump functional.

New Business: Pat reported from the nominating committee that there will be no major changes on the board, other than Whitney taking over as Maple Street Director. The General Membership meeting will be held Thursday, 12 October at 1830, with refreshments starting at 1800. The guest speaker will be Ms. Tucker, Longwood Principal. Other upcoming events include the Shrimp Boil on 16 September and Krispy Kreme sale on 21 October and 04 Nov (coinciding with Garage sale). The annual Veterans Day Ceremony at the park will be held on Saturday, 11 November. Col Ed Hubbard will be the guest speaker, a Quilt of Honor Ceremony will be held, and the names will be read, but without addresses. Dave will report on the program at next month's meeting.

Legendary Cove Subdivision: Dave discussed the Sunset Road development proposal (Legendary Cove, DR Horton) and the continuing extensions. Dave praised the County Development Team for their attention to detail. Four 4x8 signs are being made to alert neighbors to the threat of clearcutting. Bird watchers are looking for activity of the Red cockaded woodpecker, since that is a protected species.

## Quilt of Valor (QOV) Ceremony

### Greetings,

Last year we had a Quilt of Valor ceremony for a handful of Veterans during our annual Veterans Day ceremony. It was an impressive ceremony. Some of the veterans who received a quilt had tears in their eyes. For this upcoming Veterans' Day Ceremony on November 11<sup>th</sup> at 4pm near the monument, we will host another QOV ceremony. We need Veteran's, to either nominate themselves or have loved ones or friends to nominate a Veteran.

You're probably wondering what is a Quilt of Valor?

A Quilt of Valor (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation."

How do I get a QOV or get one for a family member? You nominate a Service Member or Living Veteran. Awarding a Service Member or Living Veteran a Quilt of Valor Foundation is a shared responsibility of the nominator and the QOVF Volunteer. Our QOVF volunteer is Pam Martin.

What's "touched by war"?

These examples are meant to help you better understand the phrase "touched by war."

- Engaging in direct combat, no matter when or where, in declared or undeclared wars or conflicts
- Being wounded or injured in training for combat or direct support of combat
- Serving while in harm's way delivering support, supplies, etc., to those engaged in preventing conflicts or engaged in battle or combat
- Caring for the casualties, injured, and ill service members or veterans on the frontlines, in-theater, deployed, or in hospitals and medical centers overseas or stateside
- Providing casualty assistance to families of the fallen, escorting the fallen or remains, and/or participating in honor guards
- Being there to listen, to minister, and to support others struggling with the demons of being in a war zone
- **Supporting at home for those down range can be nominated. Please do not feel your contribution to any conflict is minimal. If you have served in time of war or conflict you made a sacrifice.**
- And more....

Who is eligible for a QOV?

Any service member or living veteran who served in one of the following branches: Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard. Members of the activated National Guard and activated or active duty-special work (ADSW) reservists are included. The Army National Guard and Air Force National Guard are components of the Army and Air Force, respectively. Merchant Marines were activated from 1941 to 1945. Additionally, anyone who serves at the Dover Mortuary Facility is eligible.

- Served during declared war, conflicts, police actions, peacekeeping missions, and counter terrorism operations and/or times of peace.
- Service during, but not necessarily limited to; WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Panama, Beirut, Granada, Bosnia, the Cold War, Desert Storm, Desert Shield, Iraq, Afghanistan, anti-terrorism operations, and terrorism attacks against Armed Forces personnel is included.
- Only veterans with an Honorable or General Discharge status are eligible.

•Note: QOVF does not award QOVs posthumously. The individual must be living.

Before you nominate someone or yourself, please read the Frequently Asked Questions. This will help you to fill in the details. The organization that is giving QOV is Flying Needles Quilt Guild in Niceville.

When the form asks who QOV coordinator is put Barbara Ouellette from FNQG.

## National Preparedness Month – Dave Hensley

National Preparedness Month is an observance each September to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time. We saw the devastation of Hurricane Idalia. Hurricane Idalia initially slammed into Florida's Gulf Coast at about 7:45 a.m. on August 30<sup>th</sup> as a Category 3 hurricane with 125 mph winds — tied as the strongest to hit the Big Bend area of the state. We saw the news reports of flooding and damage to homes and businesses. According to ready.gov/plan, you need to have a plan during hurricane season. This web page has lots of information to help you prepare for emergencies.

One major concern is how will you receive emergency alerts and warnings.

You can get alerted about emergencies and other important Okaloosa County events by signing up for our Emergency Alerting System, provided to you by Okaloosa County Public Safety. This system enables us to provide you with critical information quickly in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons and evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods. You will receive time-sensitive messages wherever you specify, such as your home, mobile or business phones, email address, text messages and more. Please go to this link to sign up: <https://myokaloosa.com/eoc/home>. Select "SIGN UP HERE". In addition, you can text "OKALOOSAFL" to 888777 to anonymously sign up for only Emergency Notifications.
