The Poquito Bayou Community Association is in the process of expanding the Poquito Bayou Veterans Monument. The Veterans Monument is intended to show our neighborhood's appreciation of and to honor current and former military members who are residents or family of residents.

Twenty new posts have been purchased, cut, primed and painted. The new posts will soon be installed, providing spots for 20 personalized plaques. Plaques cost \$50 each and are available to anyone who has served or is serving in the military, along with eligible family members. Anyone interested in purchasing a personalized plaque for themselves or for another Veteran can submit the plaque order form.

Quilt of Valor (QOV) Ceremony

Last year we had a Quilt of Valor ceremony for a handful of Veterans during our annual Veterans Day ceremony. It was an awesome ceremony. Some of the veterans who received a quilt had tears in their eyes. For this upcoming Veterans' Day Ceremony on November 11th at 4pm near the monument, we will host another QOV ceremony. We need Veteran's, to either nominate themselves or have loved ones or friends to nominate a Veteran.

You're probably wondering what is a Quilt of Valor?

A Quilt of Valor (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation." How do I get a QOV or get one for a family member? You nominate a Service Member or Living Veteran. Awarding a Service Member or Living Veteran a Quilt of Valor Foundation is a shared responsibility of the nominator and the QOVF Volunteer. Our QOVF volunteer is Pam Martin.

What's "touched by war"?

These examples are meant to help you better understand the phrase "touched by war."

- Engaging in direct combat, no matter when or where, in declared or undeclared wars or conflicts
- Being wounded or injured in training for combat or direct support of combat
- Serving while in harm's way delivering support, supplies, etc., to those engaged in preventing conflicts or engaged in battle or combat
- Caring for the casualties, injured, and ill service members or veterans on the frontlines, in-theater, deployed, or in hospitals and medical centers overseas or stateside
- Providing casualty assistance to families of the fallen, escorting the fallen or remains, and/or participating in honor guards
- Being there to listen, to minister, and to support others struggling with the demons of being in a war zone
- Supporting at home for those down range can be nominated. Please do not feel your contribution to any conflict is minimal. If you have served in time of war or conflict you made a sacrifice.
- And more....

Who is eligible for a QOV?

Any service member or living veteran who served in one of the following branches: Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard. Members of the activated National Guard and activated or active duty-special work (ADSW) reservists are included. The Army National Guard and Air Force National Guard are components of the Army and Air Force respectively. Merchant Marines were activated from 1941 to 1945. Additionally, anyone who serves at the Dover Mortuary Facility is eligible.

- *Served during declared war, conflicts, police actions, peacekeeping missions, and counter terrorism operations and/or times of peace.
 *Service during, but not necessarily limited to; WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Panama, Beirut, Granada, Bosnia, the Cold War, Desert Storm, Desert Shield, Iraq, Afghanistan, anti-terrorism operations, and terrorism attacks against Armed Forces personnel is included.
- *Only veterans with an Honorable or General Discharge status are eligible.
- Note: QOVF does not award QOVs posthumously. The individual must be living.

If you want to nominate an individual, please go to https://www.qovf.org/nominations-awards

Before you nominate someone or yourself, please read the Frequently Asked Questions. This will help you to fill in the details. The organization that is giving QOV is Flying Needles Quilt Guild in Niceville.

When the form asks who QOV coordinator is put Barbara Ouellette from FNQG.

Minutes of the August 4th, 2025 meeting

Meeting called to order at 17:58 (by Michael Aid)

Present: Michael and Tammi Aid, David Boyd, Tricia Flaherty, Bob Davis, Felicia Murphy, Pam Martin, and Mary Travis.

Minutes of the June meeting had been distributed; motion to approve was made by Bob and seconded by Felicia, minutes were approved.

Old Business: Security cameras for the (county) park would likely require county permission, so the issue has been tabled. There is a new monument plaque order form for members/neighbors wishing to honor veterans within their family or circle. Ken Leone and his team have completed painting/sawing new posts for the monument, and two days will be chosen for installation. The new monument sign has been made, but requires re-painting, and will be installed once the monument renovation is complete. The new Connect 4 game has been ordered and should arrive this week. A team will determine how to best install such that it will be less likely to become vandalized like its predecessor. Felicia has arranged mowing for the park, which will continue monthly until not needed for Winter. A tree will be chosen for the park, and the board authorized up to \$500 for its purchase and installation.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Treasurer's reports for June/July was presented by Tricia. Income was \$40.00 and expenses were \$290.84. Total funds are \$11,180.20 and available funds (not obligated) are \$9,419.25. The report was approved after a motion by Mike, seconded by Bob.

Membership: Pam reported an increase of one.

Abandoned Homes Committee: No report.

Poquito Boat Ramp Park: Rocks were place, but there is still erosion under the ramp.

<u>Street & Traffic Safety/BHEV</u>: The speed detector was unfortunately not placed by the park, but still may be helping to improve safety for children. Bob will check to see if Brooks McClain can speak at the General Membership meeting about progress for Victory Village.

Street Directors: No report.

New Business: The General Membership meeting has been tentatively set for 16 October, and will be combined with a game night if possible. Trunk or Treat will be held Sat 25 October at the park. The neighborhood garage sale will be held 08-09 November (Saturday principal, Sunday rain date). The Veterans Day Ceremony will again be held 11 November at 1600. Friendsgiving is set for 22 November at 1600. The Christmas parade will be held 13 or 20 December, depending on Santa availability.

Announcements: Newsletter articles for next newsletter due to Tammi Aid by 08 August. Next PBCA board meeting scheduled 1800 on Monday, 08 September, at the Aid residence, 37 Hickory. Meeting adjourned at 18:51 pm.
